## **SOUTH ORANGE VILLAGE – STATUTORY BOARDS**

We encourage our residents to continue helping the Village make a difference. Vacancies on South Orange's Statutory Boards arise episodically. ### **BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT**

The Zoning Board of Adjustment hears requests for exceptions (variances) to local ordinances as these ordinances apply to individual properties. In so doing, the Zoning Board of Adjustment balances the interests of the townspeople with the interests of the individual property owner according to the rules established by Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL), N.J.S.A.40:55D-1 et. seq. A variance is allowed when: 1. Due to exceptional physical features of the property, compliance with an ordinance presents an exceptional hardship to the development of the property; or 2. the deviation from an ordinance advances the purposes of MLUL, the benefits of the deviation outweigh the detriments, and the deviation is not a detriment to the public good and does not impair the intent of the zoning plan. Hardship cannot be self-imposed, and the applicant bears the burden of proof.

### **PLANNING BOARD**

The Planning Board is in charge of permitted activities within the construction department. Their essential duties are to deal with policy and the implementation of that policy through the zoning, site plan and subdivision ordinances. These ordinances establish ground rules which must be met by an applicant. If the applicant meets the requirements of the particular ordinance, the board must approve the subject application. However, a site or subdivision plan can be denied if it does not fulfill a specific requirement of an ordinance.

### **SOUTH ORANGE PARKING AUTHORITY**

The South Orange Parking Authority was created in 1979 by means of an ordinance passed pursuant to the New Jersey Parking Authority Act of 1948. The Authority is an autonomous agency whose Commissioners are working in conjunction with the Village President and members of the Board of Trustees for the on-going improvement of all parking facilities.

The Parking Authority administers an agency that is responsible for the enforcement of parking ordinances and operation of all the municipal parking lots, train station lots, all metered spaces, overnight on-street parking, residential parking programs, commuter jitney buses and senior bus services. The Authority is self-sufficient with all revenues derived from permits, meters and management fees, not from tax dollars or ticket revenue.

Commissioners of the Parking Authority are appointed by the Board of Trustees for an initial period of five years and are eligible for unlimited re-appointment. The Parking Authority Board of Commissioners meets on the third Tuesday of every month at 7:15pm in Village Hall, unless otherwise advertised

### **CABLE TELEVISION COMMITTEE**

The Cable Television Committee is responsible for advising the Board of Trustees with respect to cable television, fiber-optic telecommunications television, and future alternatives, including matters pertaining to addressing the community's needs, issues which arise, regulatory, governance, oversight and technology matters and the addition of competitive alternatives to traditional cable television, including fiber-optic telecommunications television, warranting a dedicated focus. Members of the Cable Television Committee shall be comprised of the following, which shall be appointed by the Village President with advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, each for a 2-year term:

### **CIVILIAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT)**

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

### **CITIZENS BUDGET ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CBAC)**

The CBAC provides community input to assist the Village Trustees in making revenue and expense projections and setting tax and service priorities. We advocate for sound fiscal policy by:

- Reviewing annual and interim budget submissions, including the annual audit, and the budget process;
- Reviewing department budgets and operations throughout the year;
- Considering the long-term impact of capital expenditures and debt service;
- Identifying broader issues affecting the budget;
- Making timely recommendations to both the Board Finance Committee and the Board of Trustees regarding all of the above; and,
- Serving as a conduit for information about the budget between the Village administration and the public.

**ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION**

The environmental commission has power to conduct research into the use and possible use of land within the municipality, and may coordinate the activities of unofficial bodies organized for similar purposes. It may also prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts, plans and pamphlets, and may recommend to the planning board and governing body plans and programs for inclusion in the master plan for development and land use.

By law, the environmental commission shall keep a list of all open areas, publicly or privately owned, including wetlands, in order to ensure the proper use of such lands. In South Orange, the index of open lands is kept both as part of the Recreation and Open Space Index (ROSI) provided by the Village to the State Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) for all of its Green Acres grants, and by the Village Planner as part of the Master Plan. The environmental commission has advocated to the planning board and the governing body that the open space and public use zoning designation in the zoning ordinance be amended to more specifically reflect the use of our open lands.

## **RIVER CORRIDOR PROJECT COMMITTEE**

Beginning in the late 1990s, Main Street volunteers and others created a vision for the east branch of the Rahway River to restore its natural banks, remove invasive weeds, plant trees and native species, enhance fish and other habitat, and provide a walking and bicycling path along the river, connecting train stations, play fields, and downtown destinations. A mayor's advisory committee was created, primarily to steer planning decisions so as to accommodate all of the various interest groups that touched on the river and adjacent fields and urban properties as the environmental permitting and design stages advanced. The committee also coordinates activities with Village government and especially recreation groups.

The River Greenway committee is chaired by Janine Bauer and consists of several residents and others as interested stakeholders. The committee members are appointed by the Village President, and serve at his pleasure. The larger committee meets quarterly, in the evening, on dates set through Village Hall and at the convenience of the committee members. A smaller management committee meets more frequently, as needed, to resolve design and other problems. **TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

- 3) Advising the Board of Trustees as to the availability of various transportation alternatives and related grants, providing support in applying for such grants
- 4) Coordinating with and advising other committees, boards, and authorities of the Village
- 5) Coordinating with and advising with respect to regional transportation solutions and alternatives
- 6) Furnishing an annual report, on December 31" of each year, of its activities to the Board of Trustees
- 7) Performing such other transportation-related tasks as may from time to time may be requested by the Board

The Board of Education is the governing body of the South Orange - Maplewood School District with responsibility for developing policy to ensure the proper care, management and control of District affairs. The Board consists of nine citizens elected at large by the voters of South Orange and Maplewood. Board members serve three year terms, with three members of the Board subject to election each year.

In addition to setting policy, the Board hires the superintendent; approves staff hirings, transfers, resignations, terminations, and leaves of absence; approves expenditures; approves educational programs (curriculum); and otherwise ensures that the facilities and equipment are available to support learning and teaching in the District. The Board also approves the budget for the School District. However, the tax levy is approved by a separate entity, the Board of School Estimate, which is comprised of three members of the Village Trustees of South Orange, three members of the Township Committee of Maplewood and two members of the Board of Education.
