Help neighbors in crisis

When a victim of battering senses danger, nothing is more important than having strong assistance. Here in the Village, that resource is the South Orange/Maplewood Domestic Violence Response Team.

The DVRT is seeking new members to help carry out their mission. Team members are automatically called to police headquarters during a domestic violence situation. They explain options to the victim, and offer guidance on restraining orders, shelter, counseling and more — regardless of the victim's gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, race or religion.

Volunteers must be interviewed and pass a criminal background check, then attend 40 hours of daytime or evening training. For more information, South Orange residents can call Sgt. Adrian Acevedo, (973) 763-3000. Maplewood residents can call Lt. Kevin Kisch at (973) 762-3400.

Seniors, shop with new discount cards

The South Orange Classic Card, a shopping discount card for Villagers age 65 and older, is now available at the Clerk's Office. Get discounts of 10% to 25% at more than 65 participating South Orange businesses, the majority in the Village Center. Participating merchants will be listed soon on the Village Center Alliance website, www.sovillagecenter.org.

PET OWNERS: Applications for pet license renewals will be accepted by the animal control officer from mid-December through March 7, 2016. By state law, a pet's annual rabies vaccine must have an expiration date after Oct. 31, 2016. If the license shows a prior date, the pet will need a rabies booster before the license can be renewed.

For a first-time pet license, submit a completed license application along with a rabies certificate and proof of spay/neuter.

If you have moved or no longer have a pet, inform the office to prevent a warning or summons.

Be prepared but don't panic

Every family should have an emergency kit to help them survive in their house or at a shelter for several days to a week. So say health officials in South Orange and Trenton. Here's a list of survival basics to include in your emergency kit:

- At least three days worth of water — one gallon per person per day for drinking and sanitation.
- Minimum three-day supply of nonperishable food.
- Food and water for pets.
- Manual can opener and eating utensils.
- Prescription medications, first aid kit, first aid manual.
- Paper towels, moist towelettes, diapers, toilet paper and garbage bags.
- Personal hygiene items.
- Disinfectant.
- One blanket, change of clothing and footwear per person.
- Extra eye glasses or contact lenses.
- Extra keys.
- Credit card, cash or traveler's checks.
- Flashlight and extra batteries, matches in a water-proof container.
- Important documents like birth certificates in water-proof packaging.
- Important phone numbers.



In December 1864, shortly after President Abraham Lincoln's re-election, and in the midst of Sherman's march through Georgia, 18 directors of the recently organized South Orange Library Association held their first meeting.

Those times were recalled in 1896 at the opening of the Connett Memorial Building, South Orange's first library building, when Villager Edward Self recalled the "days of intense anxiety ... of alternating hope and dismay ... that ... witnessed the founding of this institution." Village President Harmon H. Hart said he "had seen monuments to the dead but this building is a monument to the living."

Current library Director Melissa Kopecky believes, "Celebration of the history of the South Orange Public Library — a community institution that preserves the past, enhances the present and evolves for the future — is a celebration of every individual who is, has been, and shall be part of this Village."

A fond farewell to Faye Cappaze of DPW



On a typical day in Public Works, residents call about sewer backups, road patching needs, sinking catch basins, curb and sidewalk damage, tilting trees . . . you name it. The continuum of crisis requires a calm demeanor, careful listening and a profound ability to prioritize.

Faye Cappaze has all that and more. For 23 years, Villagers have been hearing her slightly southern, take-charge voice on the other end of the phone, probably not realizing that at the same time, she was on emergency radio, thrusting paperwork at bypassing crewmen, and digging for documents to stanch the caller's anguish.

The whiz woman of South Orange Public Works, now 69 years old (and feisty as ever), is heading home for the last time on Nov. 6.

"I've loved Public Works more than any other job and I'm going to miss it like crazy," she says. "Every day, there's something new to learn and I love resolving problems."

"After 45 years of service, Faye has a lot of institutional knowledge

of the Township of South Orange, which made it easy for her to address complaints and concerns of residents," said DPW Director Tom Michetti. And "her drive and genuine care for residents has always been something special."

"Faye is very dedicated," said long-time friend and former fellow employee Carmel Gilby. "She's kind and caring about the guys working with her, and also a take-charge kind of person. Everyone looks to Faye as a resource. She will be dearly missed."

Faye started with the South Orange Recreation Department back in 1990. She had met her husband Anthony in her home town of Hannah, S.C., where he was stationed at Charleston Air Force Base. The two married, he finished his tour, and they moved to Anthony's home town of South Orange.

Faye's father-in-law found her an "in" at the South Orange Recreation Department and she stayed for 20 years, rising from clerk typist to principal clerk. Later she switched to Engineering, which melded with Public Works. There she reached her pinnacle title of administrative clerk.

Faye ticks off a list of department heads she's worked with: Bob Shupin, Bud Farrell, Bob O'Melia, Ed Sandve, Mario Luciani and Tom Michetti. For all of them, she has fond memories and kind words.

Faye's ability to thrive among management and workers alike has been remarkable given her extended role as a union leader. For 25 years, she presided over

the South Orange chapter of the Professional International Union, a division of AFL-CIO, and as a representative and legal aide to the larger Local 32, encompassing South Orange and four other jurisdictions.

"I helped a lot of people in that role," she recalls.

Faye was also known for 17 years as a ceramics instructor for South Orange Recreation, teaching multiple weekly classes in all age groups.

Her immediate future involves selling the Short Hills home where she and Anthony currently live and finding a retirement haven in Florida or North Carolina. She plans to spend more time with daughter Joye and granddaughters Brittany and Shannon . . . and something else that's been growing in her mind . . . "I've always wanted to record books for the blind."

No matter where she goes, Faye will be remembered fondly in South Orange because, as Tom Michetti says, "Her professionalism and kind-hearted nature have always been second to none. She has been a true friend and colleague and she will be missed."
