GREEN Toters



Newspapers

- Place in body of toter.
- Excess newspapers may be tied and stacked alongside the toter.
- Do not include high-grade paper, magazines, junk mail, cardboard or plastic bags.

Glass, Aluminum/Tin & Plastic Bottles

- Place in black insert or in the gray 20-gallon can supplied with the toter.
- Excess glass, aluminum and tin cans, and #1 and #2 plastic containers may be placed in reusable containers alongside the toter. All containers must be similar in size to the insert or the can supplied with the toter. No boxes, paper, or plastic bags.
- Do not place window-pane glass, broken glass, aluminum foil, aluminum trays, or plastics with numbers higher than #2 in the toter insert, gray can or extra containers.

Home & Business Pickup

Review the pickup schedule on the opposite page. By 7 a.m. on your pickup days, push your toter into the driveway near the curb. Make sure it is visible to work crews. The gray can goes out with the green toter.

For pickup, green toters must be out, even if empty. Green-toter recyclables are collected in two pickup cycles: newspapers are picked up by South Orange DPW and glass, plastic and cans by an outside contractor.

Dos & Don'ts

DO

Glass bottles: green, brown and clear

DON'T

- Dinnerware, ceramics
- Metal caps and rings
- Plate glass
- Broken glass
- Light bulbs

ALUMINUM / TIN

DO

Food and beverage cans, both aluminum and tin

DON'T

- TV dinner trays
- Foil food wraps, foil trays

PLASTIC

DO

- Any #1 or #2 items

DON'T

- Plastic bags
- Plastic food containers
- Plant containers

NEWSPAPERS

DO

Newspapers, newsprint

DON'T

- Telephone books
- Wet paper
- Egg cartons
- Plastic bags/wrap
- Corrugated and other cardboard boxes
- Cereal and similar boxes



Dos & Don'ts

DO

- Magazines
- Junk mail
- School notebook paper
- Soft-cover books
- Hard-cover books with covers removed
- Computer paper
- NCR paper
- Ads, inserts, coupons
- Telephone books
- Envelopes

DON'T

- Corrugated and other cardboard boxes
- Newspapers, newsprint
- Hard-cover books with covers intact
- Plastic of any kind
- Wet paper, paper food wraps



BLUE Toters

High Grade Paper Only

Includes magazines, soft-cover books, phone books, computer paper, coupons, direct-mail ads, notebook and school paper, flyers, brochures, and NCR paper.

Does not include newspaper or newsprint.

Hard-cover books may be included only after the covers are removed and discarded in regular garbage.

Any excess can be tied in bundles and placed alongside the full toter.

Home & Business Pickup

By 7 a.m. on pickup days, push your toter to the curb, making sure it is visible to work crews.

Blue-toter contents are picked up on the last Thursday of each month except in November and December when changes may occur due to Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

Improperly filled toters will not be emptied (e.g., bottles placed in the body of the green toter where newspapers belong). No regular garbage may be placed in toters.

Electronics Disposal

Eight Saturdays in 2011 will be set aside for FREE electronic drop-off in South Orange and Maplewood. Residents from both towns will be able to drop off at the Public Works Yard in South Orange on four Saturdays, and at the Maplewood Recycling Center on four additional Saturdays. The dates will be announced in future Gaslights. Proof of residency will be required at the site. Commercial and large-quantity electronics users will not be permitted to use the facilities.

Items Accepted for Drop Off:

Computers, monitors, printers, fax machines, scanners, telecom equipment, speakers, televisions, keyboards, VCRs, stereos, DVD players, toasters, old cell phones, and mainframes.

Miscellaneous Disposal

Snow Alert

In the event of substantial snow, recycling collection will be postponed until the next working day. Cancellations are aired on Seton Hall Radio Station WSOU-89.5 FM.

Construction Materials

At no time will the township pick up any type of construction material, either from residences or businesses, nor can such materials be brought to the DPW Recycling Yard.

Corrugated Cardboard

The township does not pick up corrugated boxes. Residents and business owners can drop them off at the Public Works Yard. No packing material is allowed.

Styrofoam

Styrofoam cannot be left at the DPW Depot.

Appliances, Metals, Large Household Items

Public Works will pick up all such items when arranged by appointment. Call (973) 378-7741. Glass must be removed before pickup. Refrigerator doors must be taken off. Allow six to eight weeks for an available appointment from time of call.

Metal appliances and all-metal items may be brought by residents directly to the Public Works Yard during regular hours.

Large items such as sofas, mattresses, carpeting and furniture may be brought to the yard only on container days, April through September. See the March 2011 Gaslight for dates.

Appointments made for metal or household pickup will require a \$75 fee per stop.

Recycling is the Law

Toter use is mandatory for curbside recycling in South Orange. Once a toter is purchased, collection is provided at no additional charge. An alternative to curbside recycling is drop-off at the Public Works Yard, located at 300 Walton Avenue, opposite Thornden Street. Financial assistance for toter purchase is available to qualified senior citizens and handicapped individuals.
