LETTER FROM THE MAYOR



Dear Neighbors,

As we begin the new year, I hope you and your loved ones enjoyed a restful and meaningful holiday season. Winter is often a time for reflection, and, as a community, we enter 2026 with both optimism and a clear-eyed understanding of the challenges ahead.

In November, voters overwhelmingly approved the Open Space, Recreation, and Historic Preservation Trust Fund referendum, reaffirming our shared commitment to protecting our environment and investing in the places that define South Orange. The Open Space Advisory Council will convene shortly to make recommendations as part of the upcoming budget process. At the same time, we are entering a budget cycle unlike any we've faced in recent years.

The State Health Benefits Plan is increasing by 36.5 percent, placing significant strain on employers and employees alike and complicating our ability to maintain services and appropriate staffing levels. The SHBP is widely acknowledged to be in a death spiral, and its impacts are being felt across New Jersey. I encourage residents to attend upcoming budget workshops and review materials at southorange.org as we navigate these difficult decisions together.

Despite these pressures, we continue to make meaningful progress. In mid-December, the Village received a \$279,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation for streetscape and sidewalk improvements in the train station and Sloan Street area. We also celebrated the opening of the Village Marketplace, the recruitment of a new cinema operator at SOPAC, and the re-grand opening of the Co-Lab at South Orange, a retail market that supports local entrepreneurs and small businesses.

We finalized the sale of the Village's water system to New Jersey American Water, allowing us to retire \$19.7 million in debt. NJAW has begun \$50 million in system improvements, including lead service line replacements.

A new developer has purchased the Irvington Avenue property known as The Peaks. The approved plans reflect extensive community input, and, after delays following the tragic passing of the prior owner, I look forward to introducing the new developer to the Seton Village neighborhood.

I remain deeply concerned about ICE activity and federal overreach affecting some of our neighbors. In the new year, the Village will partner with community organizations to offer "Know Your Rights" training. In the meantime, please save the Deportation & Immigration Response Equipo hotline – 888.DIRE.SOS (888.347.3767) – and call if you witness immigration enforcement activity locally.

As we closed out 2025, our community experienced profound loss. We mourned Public Works Director Joseph Foligno and retired Fire Chief Jeff Markey, both of whom dedicated their lives to serving South Orange. Their legacies will continue to guide us.

South Orange has always met challenges with compassion, resilience, and care for one another. I remain deeply grateful for this extraordinary community and optimistic about the year ahead.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY OBSERVANCE



The Community Coalition on Race (CCR) invites the SOMA community to its 25th annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Observance on Monday, Jan. 19, at 2pm at Columbia High School. This year's theme, "Do Not Erase Our History," highlights the essential role of truth and historical understanding in building the Beloved Community. The CCR is honored to welcome keynote speaker Khalil Gibran Muhammad, professor of African American studies and public affairs at Princeton University and a leading national voice on race, history, and justice.

The observance will feature brief readings from King and reflections from local leaders. Following the program, attendees are invited to view an exhibit on the history of

enslaved people in New Jersey created by the Durand-Hedden House & Garden. The CCR encourages all residents to join in the MLK Luminary Project that evening as a symbol of peace, hope, and solidarity.

Families can also participate in an early-January luminary decorating party, at which children can learn about King and design their luminary bags, at the Baird Community Center. FROM THE TAX OFFICE

The 2026 first-quarter tax payment is due on Feb. 1, with a grace period through Feb. 10. A 10-day grace period is granted every quarter. After 10 days, taxes are considered delinquent, and interest is charged from the original due date. As a reminder, taxes are due quarterly, on Feb. 1, May 1, Aug. 1, and Nov. 1. Please note that postmark dates are not honored as dates of receipt, and postdated checks will not be accepted.

Annual sewer billing will be completed in March 2026.

Taxes can be verified and paid 24/7 at southorange.org/302/Check-Pay-My-Taxes-Online:

- To verify your tax and/or sewer balance, click "Make an online tax payment," then fill out the "Tax information lookup" form.
- To pay taxes and/or sewer balances, select the appropriate payment tab above the "Tax information lookup" section on the same page.

To receive text and/or email reminders prior to due dates, as well as other tax-related communications, sign up for notifications at southorange.org/list.aspx and select the "Tax collector" and "Tax collector news" options.

TOWN HALL ON ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS

South Orange Village recently hosted a virtual town hall focused on accessory dwelling units (ADUs), highlighting how these small, self-contained homes can expand housing options while preserving neighborhood character. Village officials shared how ADUs can support aging in place, multigenerational living, and affordability, and discussed the feasibility of short-term tax incentives to help offset upfront construction costs. The conversation also explored real-world considerations, such as permitting, construction costs, and how ADUs can benefit both homeowners and the broader community. 


OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND REFERENDUM APPROVED

South Orange voters voted in favor of the increase to the Open Space, Recreation, and Historic Preservation Trust Fund (OSTF). The referendum allows the Village to increase the OSTF levy, currently set at \$0.01/\$100 of assessed value, to \$0.02/\$100 of assessed value. That's an increase of \$85/year on the average South Orange home value.

This increase will provide long-term funding dedicated to park improvements and environmental conservation efforts that benefit our community, such as the Cameron Recreation Area improvements scheduled to begin this spring. Other examples are the River Greenway Project, Crest Drive playground improvements, Founders Park improvements, Farrell Field court improvements, new lights in Meadowland Park, Chyzowych Field improvements, Grove Park improvements, and playground accessibility modifications. JOE FOLIGNO, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS

March 22, 1985 – December 8, 2025

On December 8, the Village learned of the sudden passing of Director of Public Works Joseph ("Joe") Foligno.

Foligno joined South Orange Village in 2010 as a seasonal employee and became a full-time member of the Department of Public Works team in 2012. From his earliest days, he distinguished himself not only as a hardworking and highly capable professional, but also as someone whose kindness, positivity, and unwavering can-do spirit made a lasting impact on everyone around him. These qualities made him a natural choice for appointment as director of Public Works in 2022.

"This is a tremendous loss for South Orange Village – and even more so for all of us who had the privilege of working alongside Joe as part of our South Orange family," said Village Administrator Julie Doran. "Joe was beloved by all who worked with him. Our thoughts are with Joe's family, friends, and colleagues during this difficult time."

South Orange Mayor Sheena Collum added, "Joe will be missed greatly by those of us who worked with him, and by the entire community he served and loved. Our deepest sympathies and heartfelt condolences go out to his family, friends, and everyone whose life was touched by Joe. He approached the work of the Village as if he were caring for his own home – always striving to do what was best, and to do it with efficiency, pride, and integrity. Residents who emailed him almost always received his signature 'We're on it' response – because he genuinely meant it, always eager to please and quick to help. He brought a sense of humor to even the toughest days, always smiling, always lifting others up, and he cherished working alongside what he lovingly called his brothers in Public Works. It has been a very tragic time in South Orange, as so many of us mourn a life taken far too soon."

RETIRED FIRE CHIEF JEFFREY M. MARKEY

November 8, 1948 – December 4, 2025

South Orange Village mourns the passing of retired Fire Chief Jeffrey M. Markey, who died on December 4, 2025.

Chief Markey was a devoted public servant whose leadership, professionalism, and commitment to public safety left a lasting legacy in South Orange Village. His steady presence and deep sense of duty helped shape generations of firefighters and ensured the well-being of the community he proudly served.

Chief Markey began his distinguished career with the South Orange Fire Department in 1975, rising through the ranks before being appointed fire chief in 1999. He served with integrity, compassion, and resolve until his retirement in 2012. Over the course of his 38 years of service, he earned the respect and admiration of colleagues, peers, and residents alike for his deep knowledge of the profession and his unwavering dedication to the Village.

South Orange Mayor Sheena Collum said, "Chief Markey devoted nearly four decades of his life to protecting the people of South Orange, and his impact on our community will be felt for generations. He led with calm, strength, and integrity, setting a standard of service that continues to guide those who followed in his footsteps. On behalf of the Village, I extend our deepest condolences to Chief Markey's family, friends, and the many firefighters whose lives he touched."

SOUTH ORANGE VILLAGE COUNCIL ELECTION UPDATE

In the first November election for the South Orange Village Council, the slate of Patricia Canning, Bill Haskins, and Hannah Zollman was elected to serve new terms on the governing body. The move to align the Village’s nonpartisan election with the November general election was designed to help increase voter participation.

This year’s election saw more than 5,000 residents cast ballots, with the candidates receiving a combined total of 15,197 votes.

The incoming councilmembers expressed their appreciation to the community for its engagement throughout the process.

“We’re honored to serve this incredible community and grateful for everyone who took the time to meet with us, share ideas, and talk about the future of South Orange,” said Councilmember Zollman on behalf of the slate. “This campaign has been about listening, learning, and building connections that will guide our work ahead. We’re ready to get started and proud to put Leadership in Action for our Village.”

Canning, Haskins, and Zollman will be sworn in at the annual reorganization meeting on January 6 and will begin their official duties immediately thereafter. BILL HASKINS

REELECTED TO A SECOND TERM

Councilmember Bill Haskins has been reelected to a second term on the South Orange Village Council. First elected in 2021, Haskins has chaired the Public Works & Utilities Committee and has served on the Strategic Partnership & Citizen Engagement Committee, the Planning & Economic Development Committee, and the Planning Board. He has also served as the liaison to the Parking Authority, YouthNet, and the South Orange Public Library. Now in his 20th year as a South Orange resident, Haskins brings the perspective of a daily New Jersey Transit commuter, walker, biker, and park enthusiast. During his first term, he helped reimagine the Village’s recycling system, expand tree-planting efforts, and support community-driven planning for park improvements. He is a familiar weekend volunteer with the Green Team, park conservancies, and the Repair Cafe. Haskins plans to continue advancing the Village’s zero-waste goals, oversee major parks and open-space projects – including the River Greenway, Cameron Recreation Area, and improvements in Founders Park, Grove Park, and Meadowland Park – and strengthen the Village’s response to climate-driven storms through stormwater upgrades and green infrastructure. A construction project manager with 30 years of experience, Haskins looks forward to supporting the library’s Building Connections Project and continuing to champion the infrastructure and public spaces that connect the South Orange community.

Bill, his wife and daughter have lived in South Orange for 20 years.



HANNAH ZOLLMAN

Proud to call South Orange home since 2016, Hannah Zollman has spent the past decade serving in key civic roles across the community. Prior to joining the Village Council, she served as a founding board member and Board Chair of The Co-Lab at South Orange, a board member and Treasurer of South Orange Downtown, and a member of the South Orange Planning Board. In these roles, Zollman helped launch and sustain initiatives that advanced smart growth, activated public spaces, and strengthened the Village as a hub for local entrepreneurs, small businesses, and community connection. This work gave her hands-on experience collaborating with partners, engaging residents, and translating community ideas into visible, on-the-ground results. Named South Orange’s Villager of the Month in April 2024 for her “perpetual volunteerism,” Zollman has also served on the South Mountain YMCA board, led the Montrose preschool PTA, and been active at Congregation Beth El. She and her family are early lead supporters of the South Orange Public Library’s capital campaign and contribute to community life through mutual aid, neighborhood events, and local initiatives. Professionally, Zollman is the founder and CEO of Mission Driven Consulting, where she helps nonprofits build sustainable, high-impact organizations. She lives in Montrose with her husband and son and is committed to fostering an inclusive, connected, and welcoming South Orange for all.

PATRICIA CANNING

Patricia Canning is a 20-year South Orange resident with a long record of community service. She has served on the South Orange/Maplewood Community Coalition on Race, where she helped create programs such as “Talking to Children About Race” and founded the MLK Luminary Project. As a member of the South Orange Environmental Commission, she led the award-winning “S.O. Not Plastic” campaign. Canning has also actively supported our local schools, serving as a board member on the PTAs of South Mountain Elementary, South Orange Middle, and Columbia High School, always working to make participation more inclusive for all families. In addition, Canning served on the board of the Achieve Foundation, which raises funds for tutoring and for SOMSD educators. In recognition of her service to the community, Canning was awarded the MLK service award by the South Orange Civic Organization and was honored by the Community Coalition on Race. She currently serves on the board of the New Jersey Conservation Foundation. Professionally, Canning has decades of project-management experience with nonprofits; major firms, including Deloitte Consulting; and, recently, her own project management services firm, The PMC Solutions Group. She is an avid triathlete and founded a local women’s training group that helped more than 100 first-time racers complete a sprint triathlon. Canning and her husband, Jim, have two daughters, both of whom attended SOMA schools from kindergarten through Columbia High School.




