Summer concerts, lounging at the pool, the farmers market, and outdoor dining. You know it's summertime in South Orange, and please don't forget your sunscreen.

It's wonderful to be back for a third term as Village President, so I must begin by saying "thank you so much" for allowing me to continue in this role. I'm equally excited that Trustee Summer Jones has returned with the incredible additions of Jennifer Greenberg and Olivia Lewis-Chang.

#### **A lot of exciting initiatives are underway, so get ready!**

- The Baird Community Center will reopen this year. You've heard me talk about this nonstop because it's so exciting. The extensive renovations include adding an indoor field house, our new art gallery, porch, café, and numerous rooms that will restart our extensive programming. I appreciate everyone's patience, but the end is near, and I promise it will have been worth the wait.
- The South Orange Public Library has joined the Bergen County Cooperative Library System (BCCLS), which will take effect in 2024, giving residents unprecedented access to more than 5,000,000 physical books, 60,000 digital resources, and walk-in privileges at member libraries. This is a welcome addition because, as we all know, the library will be undergoing some major work, including renovating the current library, rehabilitating the historic Connett building, and constructing a link connecting the two buildings for a 21st century experience that is long overdue.
- The second phase of the River Greenway project will commence this fall, completing a path from Third Street through Waterlands Park to Chyzowych Field, near the Maplewood border at Parker Avenue. A new bridge will carry the Greenway over the river past the DPW yard and the former pump house. For all our walking and biking enthusiasts, this project will be a game changer for our community and hopefully will encourage less reliance on vehicles.
- The Village is reapplying for a Green Acres matching grant this fall to deliver a new, exciting vision of the former "Cameron Courts" with the participation of over 800 community members. The new recreation area includes paddle tennis courts, pickleball courts, basketball courts, a resiliency adventure garden, a rain garden, fitness stations, picnic areas, and a natural grass lawn. Our collective fingers are crossed!

In other news, our Water Utility Task Force is concluding its report, working with consultants and our professional staff to present to the Board of Trustees a recommendation on the future of our water utility. The task force evaluated the most efficient and cost-effective structure to deliver high-quality water to our residents and stakeholders, including expanding the existing water utility to meet increased demands or a potential asset sale to a private water operator.

Finally, the Board of Trustees is also in the middle of a Charter Review, which is required at least every 12 years. Current recommendations include statutory updates, modernizing the titles of the governing body to reflect their functions, permitting the governing body to move municipal elections to November, and permitting the governing body to adopt stipends if deemed appropriate. ## SOUTH ORANGE REELECTS VILLAGE PRESIDENT COLLUM AND TRUSTEE JONES, AND WELCOMES NEW TRUSTEES!

On May 6, South Orange Village President Sheena Collum and Trustee Summer Jones were reelected to new four-year terms. Their running mates, Jen Greenberg and Olivia Lewis-Chang, were elected to their first terms as trustees, replacing outgoing Trustees Steve Schnall and Donna Coallier.

Collum is now serving her third term as Village president. In 2015, she was the first woman ever to be elected to serve as the township's chief executive officer. Today, she continues to prioritize stabilizing property taxes; infrastructure and capital planning; economic development; citizen engagement; and streamlining municipal operations through consolidations, shared services, and the use of technology.

## VILLAGE HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED

This is Jones' second term as Village trustee. During her first term she served on the Strategic Partnership and Citizen Engagement Committee, the Planning and Economic Development Committee, and the Recreation and Cultural Affairs Committee. Jones has also previously served on the Health and Public Safety Committee. During her first term, Jones was instrumental in multiple projects, including the planning of 270 Irvington Avenue and 133 Fairview Avenue; relaunching The Gaslight newsletter; reimagining the Cameron Field Complex; and revitalizing Carter Park. She was also the trustee appointed to be acting Village president when the Village president is unavailable to perform her duties.

Trustee Greenberg will focus on the development of accessory dwelling units, which offer a host of benefits, from added income and increased property value to more space and privacy; they also provide more options for members of our community to remain local when downsizing. She will also chair the Planning and Economic Development Committee, stewarding the exciting and continual growth of South Orange's Downtown. Raised in the historic Montrose section of South Orange, Greenberg grew up with three older brothers and attended Marshall Elementary School, South Orange Junior High School, and Columbia High School. Greenberg graduated from New York University with degrees in psychology and music, and worked in advertising and marketing in New York City before returning to South Orange in 2004 to raise her family. Greenberg enjoys spending time with her blended family of seven. You'll see her playing tennis, paddle ball, and pickleball, and driving with Louie, her Saint Bernard, who is an integral part of the family and is recognized around town thanks to his strong presence on social media.

Trustee Lewis-Chang is a 26-year resident of South Orange and has been passionate about building community and caring for the environment for many years. She is a member of the South Orange Environmental Commission and is an active member of its Shade Tree Committee. In 2011, she helped lead the establishment of the South Orange Community Garden and now serves as the garden group's chair. Lewis-Chang is the chair of the Village's Health and Public Safety Committee and a member of the Planning and Economic Development Committee, as well as the Public Works and Utilities Committee. Lewis-Chang will also serve as liaison to the Community Coalition on Race, the South Orange Environmental Commission, and the Board of Education. Lewis-Chang is a clinical psychologist in private practice. She is an avid reader and gardener, and enjoys good food and spending time at the beach. She is married to Michael Chang; together they have raised Adam and Cassandra. They are parenting again with their nephew Obrian. Lewis-Chang is the proud grandmother of Aurora Rose.

## NEW VILLAGE ADMINISTRATORS APPOINTED

The South Orange Board of Trustees unanimously appointed two new village administrators during its April 25 meeting. Julie Doran, who previously held the temporary position of Acting Village Administrator, was permanently installed into the Village Administrator role. Recreation and Cultural Affairs director Peter Travers was selected as Deputy Village Administrator. Doran joined Village Hall in 2021 after managing the business districts in SOMA for 12 years. Travers has worked for South Orange starting part time as a teen in 2002 going on to be appointed Director of Rec in 2020. Village President Collum noted that she is "especially proud to be promoting from within, it's great to see our employees move through the ranks and succeed."


# AROUND TOWN



# BOARD OF TRUSTEES INITIATIVES



Under the leadership of Village Trustee Bill Haskins, several important environmental initiatives have moved forward, to the benefit of our community.

## TREES

Recognizing the significance of our tree canopy in protecting our environment and our quality of life, Trustee Haskins and the South Orange Environmental Commission led the way in securing an additional \$100,000 in funding for tree replanting in 2023. With a goal of replacing over 3,000 trees lost to severe weather events, disease, and age, thanks to these funds we can add approximately 250 trees to our long-term tree replanting program this year. The Village administration and Environmental Commission continue to seek additional grants and donations to increase the number of trees replanted in future years. ## LEAF BLOWER REGULATIONS

### GAS-POWERED LEAF BLOWERS PROHIBITED



Led by Trustee Haskins, the Board of Trustees passed regulations prohibiting the use of gas-powered leaf blowers from May 1 through September 30 of each year. We ask everyone who uses landscapers to remind them of this prohibition in order to avoid fines and help protect our environment.



## RECYCLING PROGRAM

The South Orange Village trustees and administration thank residents for their support and patience as we transitioned to our new dual-stream recycling program. Change can be difficult, and this process was no exception. However, with a decrease in missed pickups and scheduling issues getting ironed out, good news is emerging. Trustee Haskins reports that, "First-quarter data collected by our Department of Public Works is showing cost savings of over 15% in our curbside recycling program, and our processor, Bayshore, has confirmed that our switch to dual-stream recycling means that more of our recycling is getting recycled and less thrown away."



To avoid having your property appear on the list, call the tax collector's office or visit [southorange.org/302/Check-Pay-My-Taxes-Online](http://southorange.org/302/Check-Pay-My-Taxes-Online) to ensure that you do not have a tax or sewer balance for the 2022 calendar year.


